**Lincoln's "Last, Shortest and
Best Speech"**

Here is what Abraham Lincoln himself called his own "last, shortest and best speech." It is reproduced from Stoddard's "Abraham Lincoln, The Man and the War President." In that book the item is printed in facsimile, in Lincoln's own handwriting. It is related that the President himself in one of his few spare moments wrote it out for Noah Brooks, then a Washington correspondent for one of the New York papers, for Mr. Brooks to print as a newspaper paragraph:

"On Thursday of last week two ladies from Tennessee came before the President asking the release of their husbands held as prisoners of war at Johnson's Island. They were put off till Friday, when they came again, and were again put off to Saturday. At each of the interviews one the ladies urged that her husband was a religious man. On Saturday the President ordered the release of the prisoners, and then said to this lady: 'You say your husband is a religious man; tell him when you meet him, that I say I am not much of a judge of religion, but that, in my opinion, the religion that sets men to rebel and fight against their government, because as they think, that government does not sufficiently help SOME men to eat their bread in the sweat of OTHER men's faces, is not the sort of religion upon which people can get to heaven.'

QUALIFICATIONS**

**FACTS OF INTEREST TO THOSE
WHO WISH TO VOTE AT NEXT
ELECTION—MAY REGISTER
BEFORE ANY NOTARY PUBLIC**

Here are some of the necessary qualifications for registration and information to be given: Any male or female person above the age of 21 years, who is a citizen of the United States, or naturalized as such, during the six months immediately preceding, may register before the county clerk in person, or before any notary public or justice of the peace in the county, in the precinct in which they reside.

Those desiring to vote in the primary nominating election, must state their political preference, to enable them to participate therein. The true street address must be given, of those residing in incorporated towns; the section, township and range must be given by those residing outside of towns and cities.

In case of naturalized citizens, the naturalization papers or proof of same, must be exhibited before the registering officer. Those living in the county seat must register before the county clerk; those living outside the county seat may register before the County Clerk or any notary public or justice of the peace who have qualified for their office.

WILL BAR ASIATICS

South Carolina Will Not Permit Them to Acquire Land (By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times)
COLUMBIA, S. C., Feb. 11.—The Stuckey bill to prohibit Asiatics from acquiring land in South Carolina was passed without a dissenting vote to the third reading in the Senate today. A similar bill is pending in the House.

BALTIMORE, Md., Feb. 12.—Under the auspices of the Junior League, a historical pageant opened yesterday for a five-day series of dances of all kinds. Old-time dances of the past generations and the newest steps that Paris and New York are evolving each day will be shown in "The Merry Whirl" and "Quaker Dance," and composed some of the daintiest ideas in the whole scope of the dance. The costumes have been changed to the "Priscilla" Friends in this city protest against calling the gay little dance by the name of their sect, so the costumes changed the costumes from demure Quakers to the breeches wigs and dainty little gowns of Puritans.

PARCEL POST FOR CANADA

OTTAWA, Can., Feb. 11.—Canadian postal authorities have opened a parcel post service for people of the Dominion. A one-mile radius constitutes a local card from which the postmaster sees at a glance what are the rates and those for forwarding parcels of varying weight to the different provincial zones. Eleven grams is the weight limit of parcels.

TEXAS GOES ON A CASE

REBELS TO COIN MONEY

CHIHUAHUA, Feb. 12.—Coin issued by the Bank of Sonora, Mineral Bank and other banks established under the Diaz regime, be treated as counterfeit money under a decree issued by the government. The free and unlimited usage of silver bearing the national stamp, is offered as a substitute and means of providing money. The embargo remains less in the rebel territory than dollars in paper money.
