although the average expendi-ture on the improvement of roads exceeds one million dollars a day, a large portion of the money in the United States is wasted because of the failure to build the right type of road to meet local requirements, or failure to provide for the continued maintenance of the improvement.

Investment of money in new roads does not hecome real economy until pro-vision is made for keeping these new roads in condition after they are built. If a new road is built and then allowed to fall into disrenair, much of original investment is simply wasted.

#### HARBOR APPROPRIATIONS

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 12. The House river and harbor com-mittee agreed to a provision in the river and harbor bill appropriating \$1,000,000 for continuing the work on the north jetty at the mouth of the Columbia River, but made no provision for placing the north jetty project on a continuing contract basis. Senator Chamberlain said, after bearing from Portland, that he would support the Lane amendment authorizing an appropriation dredge for use at the mouth of the Columbia River.
