Woman Suffrage in Colorado

The following quotation is from a letter written by a Baptist minister, Rev. A. H. C. Morse, of Denver, Colorado, in reply to an inquiry as to his views on woman suffrage in that state. He says: "Now, as to Colorado, I do not think that anyone here would like the ballot to be taken away from the women, and this is a pretty good argument that it is being well used by the women. Women in this state are found to be on the side of public good, and they seem to hold the balance of power. They are helpful in regulating public evils and uniformly call for the extermination of the social evil. I did not think when I came here nine years ago, that I'd be for it, but residence here shows me that it is coming everywhere, and that it will be for our good.

The prohibition states are Maine, Kansas, North Dakota, Georgia, Mississippi, Tennessee, Oklahoma, North Carolina and West Virginia.
