## NEWS OF NEARBY TOWNS

### MANY WANT TO VOTE.

#### Seventeen Apply for Naturalization in Coos County

In the circuit court of Coos county now there are seventeen applicants for naturalization waiting their final papers. These cases had been set for hearing on April 24, but on Tuesday Judge Coke, in view of that date being within less than ninety days of the May primaries, postponed the hearing until May 24. Of the seventeen prospective citizens only one hails from Coquille. The following are the nationalities represented: Finland, 6; Germany, 3; Norway, 2; Italy, 1; Canada, 1; England, 1; Greece, 1; Isle of Crete, 1; Denmark, 1.

Since the new national law in regard to naturalization was enacted in 1906, 301 men have been made citizens of the United States in the circuit court of Coos county.—Coquille Sentinel.

### BEAR CREEK ROAD CASE.

The case of Thomas Draine vs. Road District No. 20, which embraces the Bear Creek country above Bandon, was brought to a sudden termination when District Attorney Liljeqvist refused to plead further in the case, and on motion of plaintiff's attorney, J. O. Stemmler, the court granted a permanent restraining order, thereby setting aside the election.—Myrtle Point Enterprise.

#### News of City-by-the-Sea as Told by the Recorder

Wm. McEwen, who had his arm amputated at the Bandon Hospital on February 2 as a result of an accident in a logging camp, is getting along as well as could be expected at present and will be able to leave the hospital in a short time.

The Telegraph, the new passenger boat of the Myrtle Point Transportation Company, was launched Sunday at Herman Brothers' shipyard near Prosper. The new boat will be one of the finest appointed boats in this section of Oregon. She is eighty-five feet long and will have 280 horse power. The new boat will carry from 150 to 200 passengers and will be one of the speediest boats on the river. She will be furnished with street car chairs, will have double cabins and all the equipment of a modern passenger boat. The Telegraph will probably be in operation in about a month and will run regularly between Bandon and Myrtle Point.

### GREAT DOCKS AT HALIFAX.

#### Johnson Porter Tells of Big Contract There.

A Portland paper says: "J. P. Porter, of the contracting firm of Porter Bros., returned to Portland yesterday after a two-months' stay in the east, which was put in mostly at Halifax, Nova Scotia, where the firm has just started work on the \$6,000,000 unit of the government docks there. He also visited New York City and Montreal.

The docks will be used as terminals for the Grand Trunk Pacific, the Canadian Pacific and the Canadian Northern railroads, and the plans call for an ultimate expenditure of \$18,000,000 for dock construction.

The docks will be of granite and concrete, according to Mr. Porter. The first unit, which the firm has the contract to build, includes a dock proper 5000 feet long and one 1200 foot slip and one-half of another slip of equal length.

Mr. Porter's journey was made necessary by the fact that work is just being started. The docks will be completed in three years.

"The Canadian government will do wonderful things at Halifax," said Mr. Porter. When it gets through, Halifax will have docks second to none in any part of the world, and with a 45 foot draft at low water, will be in position to handle any amount of ocean traffic."
