**CAPT DUNSON**, the genial and faithful keeper of the Cape Arago light, was in Marshfield yesterday for the first time since before Christmas.

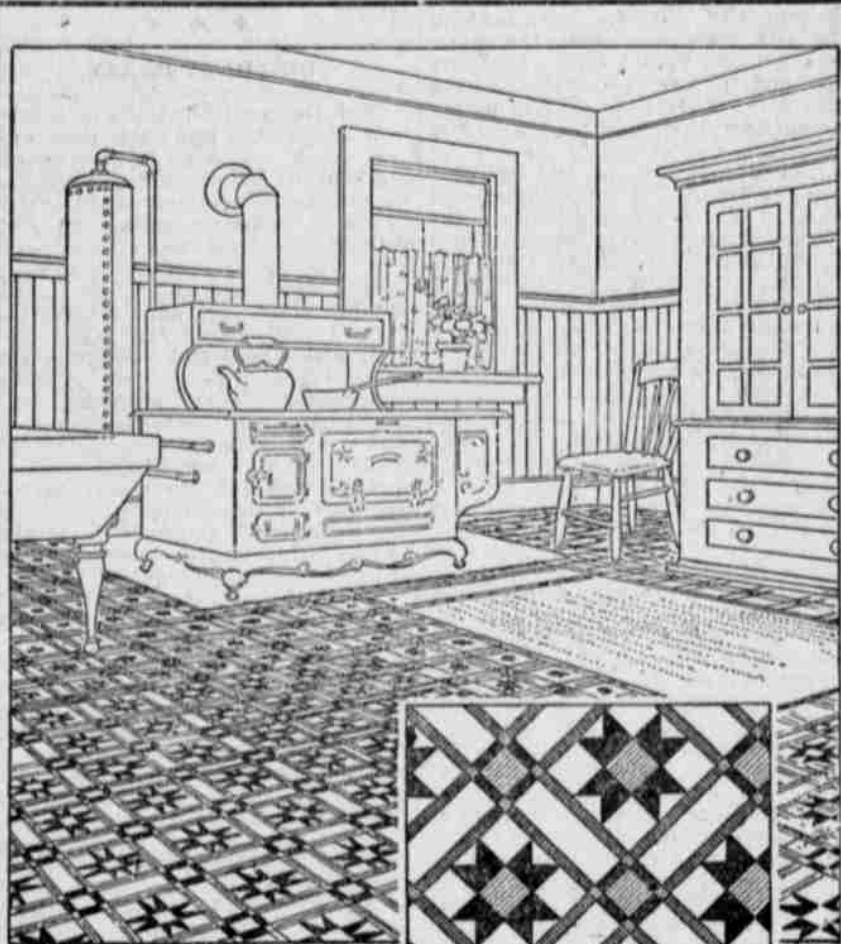
## HELD FOR ROBBERY

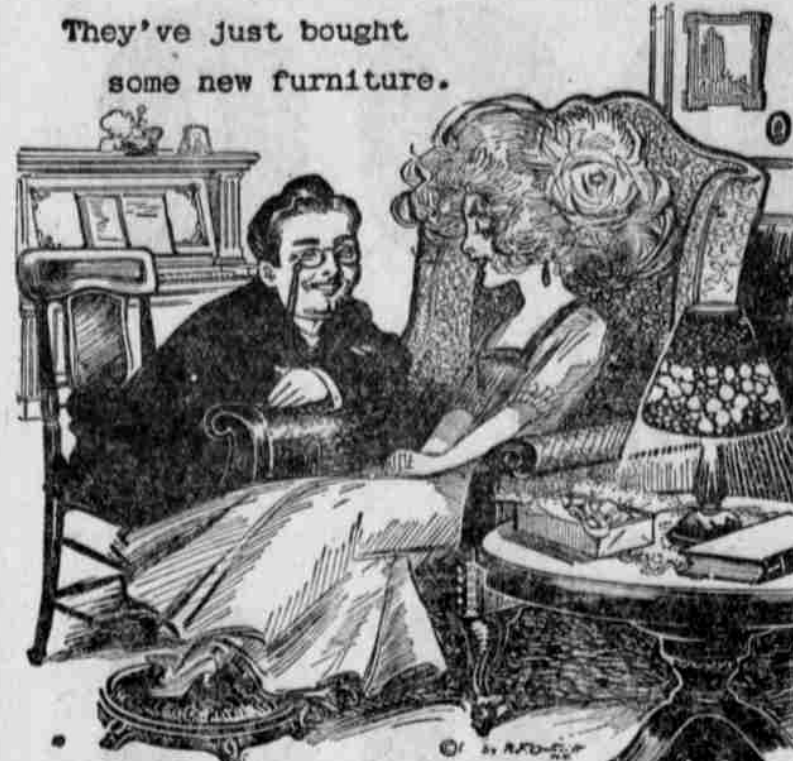
