PARKER WINS ROUND

Former Marshfield Man Gains Point In Litigation.

John A. Parker, formerly of Marshfield, but now of Florence, has won a point in his suit against the C. A. Smith Company. Parker is suing for \$10,000 because he was discharged following his beginning a suit for damages against the company when his brother was killed as a result of his motorcycle hitting a woodpile on South Broadway. Parker did not lose his hand in an accident in the mill, but from bloodpoisoning and with this ex-

ception, the following version of it from a Portland paper is taken as correct:

"John A. Parker, a mechanic in the C. A. Smith lumber mill at Marshfield, lost his right hand, which was cut off in the mill machinery, in 1908. He settled with the company for about \$200 and the oral agreement on the part of the mill manager that he was to have a job around the place as long as he wanted it. He was discharged in January, 1913, and has filed suit in the Federal Court, charging breach of contract. The defendant

company, through its attorneys, filed a demurrer, and United States District Judge Bean held that Parker had a right to demand a fulfillment of this oral contract and that the case should be tried out on its merits before a jury."
