

# DEVELOPMENT NEWS OF OREGON

## Interesting Items About the Growth and Enterprise in Sections of State

Tillamook county cheese factories produced 4,101,962 pounds in 1913, as against 3,996,250 pounds in 1912. Cars on the first interurban street-car line at Merford began to operate March 29th.

The Hillsboro Commercial Club is backing the Boecker wickerwork factory, and a project for a new sawmill. A meat packing plant with cold storage facilities on a large scale are assured at Redmond.

H. J. Firehan of the Albany bakery has the backing of Montana capitalists for establishing a cracker factory.

The Oregon Welfare Commission is considering raising the apprenticeship period for women learners to eighteen months.

Contracts have been let for the construction of eight concrete bridges on the Columbia River highway.

The state peddler law, held to be in restraint of trade, is being attacked in the Federal courts at Portland by a tea company.

West Linn citizens have decided to support the erection of two new school buildings to cost \$12,000 each.

Astoria Masonic lodge will erect a fireproof office building and lodge hall.

The shipbuilding industry at St. Helens increases in activity.

A favorable sign all over Oregon is the establishment and extension of local packing plants with cold storage facilities.

Roseburg and Eugene report prospects for a very favorable building season.

Calipoolia Grange has adopted resolutions strongly opposing the proposed eight hour laws.

Engineer Fontaine of the Willamette Pacific says 2000 men will rush the railroad between Eugene and Marshfield to completion by fall.

A steel and wood truss bridge will be built across Chuteo River in Curry county.

A ten hour law for men is sustained by the recent decision of the Oregon Supreme Court.

A Salem bank capitalized at \$100,000 pays \$2000 taxes—six per cent on its capital stock.

The Eugene Commercial Club will make securing factories and payrolls of first importance in its publicity work for the coming year.

Cottage Grove business men have a committee raising \$10,000 stock subscription for a cannery.

The shipping that went over the Coos Bay bar in 1913 aggregated \$65,000 tons.

Clackamas county is to have a new jail.

The historical courthouse of Marion county is being remodelled for about the fifteenth time.

The case of Frank C. Stettler vs. the Oregon Welfare Commission will be appealed to the Supreme Court of the United States.

A new armory is to be built at Portland on the east side, to cost \$50,000.

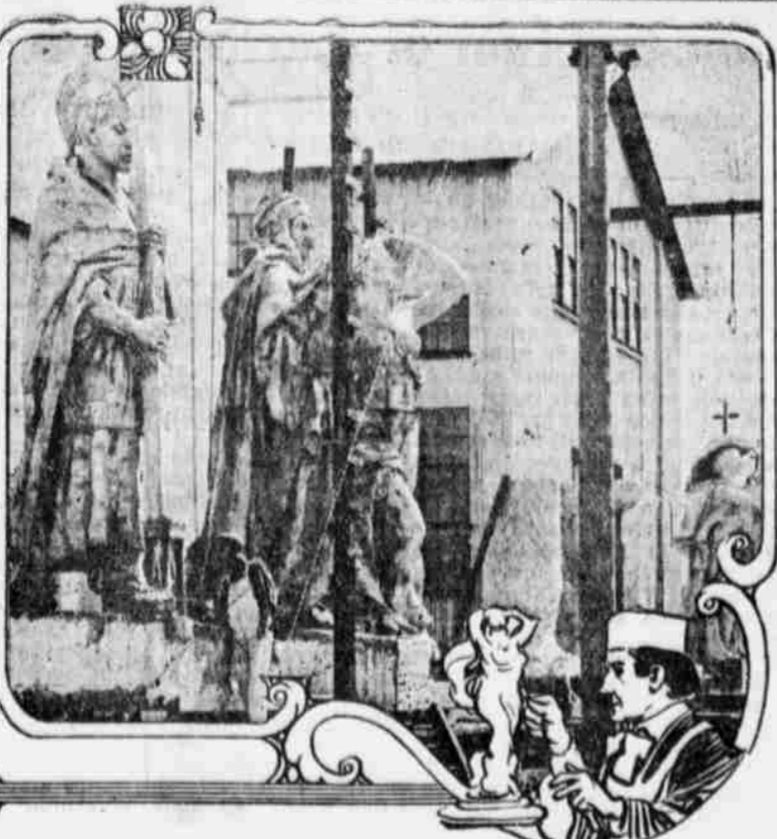
The Knights of Pythias will erect a two-story lodge building at North Plains.

Pendleton will vote on \$50,000 water bonds to complete its gravity system.

It is generally considered that the \$1000 tax exemption proposed would cause the great burden of taxation to fall on employing industries.

The Phoenix stone quarry of Douglas county claims to have moved the biggest block of stone on record—141x125 feet—unbroken.

In the Paulina and Des Chutes reserves, 400,000 acres of public lands are to be thrown open to bona fide settlers.

## CRAWFORD TO WIN NOMINATION

Gov. West Concedes Nomination of Attorney General in Primaries. SALEM, Or., March 25.—Governor West gave out for publication the following statement:

"Crawford is going to be nominated by the Republicans for Governor. I have thought so for some time, but it was settled when Stevens withdrew. The vote of the liquor people would have been split up between Stevens, Crawford and Moser. But little of it would have gone to Moser, because it is well known he hasn't a ghost of a show. Now, with Stevens out of the race, it will all go to Crawford. His nomination is made doubly sure by my opposition, and pointing out his delinquencies will attract to his standard all that element who are opposed to me on account of my activities in the direction of law enforcement, and while he will have for his support a motley crowd, he will have enough votes to nominate, because the several clean law enforcement candidates will divide the vote of the better element throughout the state and thus cut each other's throats. Of course, this being a fight in the Republican primaries is little concern of mine, but I believe Crawford will be nominated."
