Pitcher George Baumgardner refused a \$4000 offer from the Federals to leave the Browns this season. George says he is very well satisfied where he is at present.

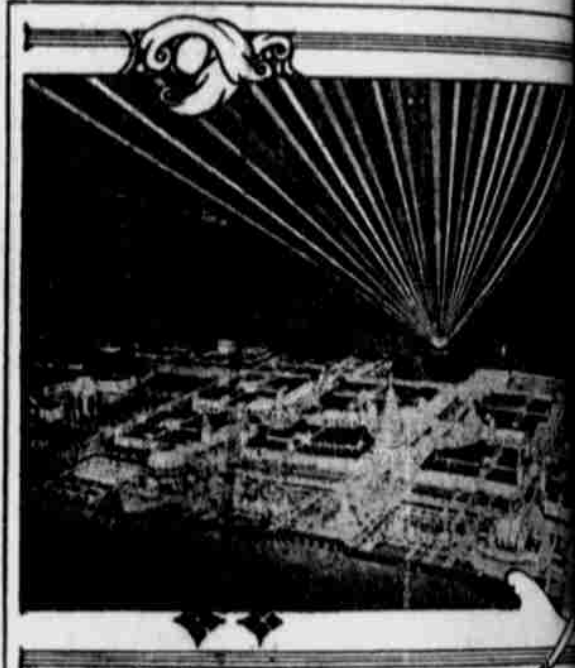
