SUPPLIES FOR RAILWAY WORK

Frederick Barbound at Astoria With Cargo-Eugene Line Progresses

SUGENE, Or., March 30.—The Suard says: A barge load of railsoad building equipment consisting of two steam shovels, sixty dump ears, six locomotives, four or five miles of track and a large amount of hay, grain and camp supplies is now held at Astoria, storm bound on the barge Frederick, and will be shipped to Porter Bros. Grant Smith Company at Glenada as soon as clear weather sets it. The head-quarters for the Porter Bros.-Grant Smith Company has been moved to Menada from Mapleton and at the latter city will be located their head offices.

The work on tunnel No. 7, seven miles south of the crossing of the Umpqua River, is reported to be progressing rapidly and 1850 feet of the tunnel is now completed. This tunnel is 4200 feet long and is the longest on the entire line from Eugene to Marshfield,

The MacArthur-Perks Company, which has the contract for the grading on this line, has begun the shipping in of men to fill up the line camps as soon as they are put in shape. Yesterday eighty-five men were brought down from Portland and sent out to Mapleton. The WacArthur-Perks Company has made arrangements with the Southern Pa-Company for the transportaton of these men and on Mondays' Wednesday and Fridays an extra wednesday and Fridays an extra geach is brought down on south-bound train No. 13 from Portland to Eugene for the use of these la-borers. The foreman in charge of the men transfer them to the Wil-famette Pacific work train and they are carried out to the Half-Way House, one-half mile on this side of Walton. From here they walk on into Mapleton or ride on the freight wagons.
