Take Degrees—E. J. Loney, W. H. Meredith and Joe Cox of Curry county came up last night to take degrees in Masonry at a meeting of Blanco lodge. Mr. Williams, the Cape Blanco wireless operator, is also here for the same purpose.

Masonic Meeting—There will be a meeting of Marshfield Masonry this evening, the Temple and Royal Arch degrees being conferred. The session starts about 5:30 and supper will be served at the hall and the work will continue until late.

Reduce Fill—Owing to the possibility that the yardage to be removed from the channel in front of Marshfield not being as great as first figured, the fill in West Marshfield near Tenth street is being reduced some in order to insure sufficient dirt to fill Mill Slough proper.

Pulp Mill Resumes—The Smith pulp mill, which has been closed down for ten days, will resume operations next Monday. They were short of lime, of which they use large quantities, and received a shipment on the Adeline. The Eastside mill is being tested out today and everything is in readiness to start at full capacity Monday.
