COUPLE SEEK EACH OTHER FOR THIRTY-FIVE YEARS

NEW YORK, April 9.—A game of blind man's buff lasted for thirty-five years has just been ended by a grieving husband and a heart-broken wife, who were the players. In Cairo, Egypt, thirty-five years ago, Alfred Welland was a prosperous British merchant. He and his wife, Mary lived a life that was free from care. When the Turkish-Russian war broke out, a year later Welland was offered a commission by the Turkish General, Osman Pasha, his friend, and he marched away as an officer, leaving his wife and their infant son in Cairo. Letters reached Mrs. Welland until the siege of Plevna, then a long silence. When the bulletins poured in with their names of dead and wounded, Welland's name was among the dead. The home in Cairo was sold, and Mrs. Welland and her small son went to Australia, finally coming to the United States. When the war ended the Russian prisoners gave up their captives; among them was Welland. Slowly he made his way to the home in Cairo, only to learn his wife and child had disappeared. Friends thought they had gone to Australia.

so to that far country Welland followed, only to learn they had come to America. Again he took up the search only to hear that a woman and a boy, answering the descriptions he gave had died in a fever epidemic. From New York he went to Canada, and settled in business, still following any clues he found hoping against hope. While in New York recently some friends knowing his story, thought of a gray haired woman, whose story was the counterpart of this old soldiers. With hope once more aflame he hastened to her home and rapped timidly. When the door opened, the two looked at each other, and he struggled for speech. "Mary!" he cried. "I've hunted all over the world for you!" And the wearisome game was played.
