Prosperous North Dakota The population of North Dakota has nearly doubled since prohibition came into effect. It has increased 80.8 per cent in the last ten years.

The assessed valuation has increased more than three fold. North Dakota has no saloons, but it has one bank for every 749 inhabitants.

The per capita bank deposit is \$138. The per capita wealth is \$2,047, which is larger than any other state.

We have only 1.4 prisoners for every 5000 population. Eight counties in the state have no prisoners in the penitentiary, nine counties have but one each, and twelve have but two each.

Fourteen county jails are reported empty. Four counties have no jails and seven counties have but one or two prisoners. Pembina county has had no prisoners in jail for two years, and has not had to call a jury to try a criminal case for a year and a half at a time.

We have 50 organized counties, 42 of which have no poor houses and the few scattering poor houses of the state have but few inmates.

I think there is not a druggist's permit to sell intoxicating liquors for medical purposes in the state today; the last two expired in January. This brings the state under absolute prohibition, and the law is better enforced than ever.

A Good Record for Kansas In Kansas, the prohibition state par excellence, the newspapers have been forced to abandon whiskey advertisements, effectively, and at present out of 700 newspapers in the state, less than a dozen have the courage of carrying whiskey advertisements.

Commenting on this fact, an article in the Lawyer's Magazine "Cases and Comments" says, that because of public sentiment existing in that state, conditions have radically changed and it sizes up the results as follows: "Of the 105 counties in the state, 87 have no insane, 54 no feeble minded, 96 no inebriates, 65 no prisoners serving sentences; 38 county poor farms have no inmates; 53 county jails are empty."

Kansas is the richest state in the Union per capita; the death rate has dropped from 17 to 7 1-2 per thousand. Illiteracy has dropped to less than two per cent.

With this kind of statistics as a basis, exemplifying the benefits of prohibition it is little wonder that efforts are being put forth to obtain similar restrictions elsewhere. May a propitious Providence hasten the time when such righteous restrictions shall prevail throughout our entire country.
