Former Curry County Teacher Has Troubles at Commencement.

CLATSkanie, Or., May 21.—Mrs. Flora I. Foreman, the deposed principal of Quincy District School, held her class graduation exercises at the Socialist Hall in Quincy, County Superintendent Wilkerson mailed direct to her the diplomas of the four pupils who have attended her school in the kitchen of the Socialist Hall since her dismissal from the school. Francis Dixon, Oscar Dixon, Charlotte Overlie and Lincoln Lillich, the four graduates, took the pledge of universal brotherhood. Two other pupils who did not take the state examination, but who were presented with blank "diplomas" by Mrs. Foreman, also took the pledge. The exercises of the class graduation consisted largely of dancing. Colonel C. E. S. Wood was present and addressed the people.
