## T. RICHARDSON GIVES VIEWS

### Portland Booster Says Coos Bay Has Many Big Projects and Is Metropolitan.

The Portland Oregonian says: "I had a great time down on the Pacific front of Oregon during the last two weeks," said Tom Richardson after an extended trip through Coos County and the western portions of Douglas and Lane counties. "The people down there are tremendously optimistic and enthusiastic over the coming of the Willamette Pacific Railroad. They have waited so long and wished so diligently for this connection with the outside world that they count it about the greatest blessing that could happen to them."

"At Coos Bay they have decided to issue \$200,000 in bonds for deep water in addition to \$200,000 voted before. This will mean a 25-foot channel, 500 feet wide, from the Smith mills to the bar, and all of the towns and communities on the bay are in favor of this improvement."

"Marshfield wears a metropolitan air. Its wholesale business is increasing and 38 regular employed traveling men, as representatives of outside houses, make their permanent homes in Marshfield."

"In addition to their Chamber of Commerce, which is very aggressive, there is a semi-social and business organization known as the Millicoma Association."

"Marshfield in dredging her deep channel is filling up a vast portion of the lowlands near the bay and there is a great deal of this kind of work also at North Bend. The most spectacular thing in the way of a town development is the regrading of North Bend. This regrade covers almost the entire townsite below the hills."

"At Coquille there is a movement for a Coos County organization of all the commercial bodies in Coos County getting together for the advancement of the general public."

"Myrtle Point is a bright, active community and Bandon is among the most attractive and wide-awake towns

## Better Business Conditions Seem Assured

**A**L L UP and down the nation, and from one side to the other, come predictions from business men of wide repute that as a result of the achievements of the Democratic campaign coupled with the prospect of bountiful crops a long period of business improvement is directly ahead of the country.

Ralston, president of the Ralston Steel Car company, whose opinions carry great weight in the business world, declares that general business conditions are on a sound basis, and that with the prospect for good crops that are now half made the country is about to enter upon a period of pronounced prosperity.

Confidence in the banking system is expressed by John B. Pittie, of Louisville, vice president of the Louisville Trust company.

"From present indications," he says, "it appears that the new banking law will work smoothly and give general satisfaction."

Mr. Pittie is much gratified at the prospect for a big wheat crop throughout the nation and says that if the promises for good crops hold out the national prosperity will be much enhanced.

Irving T. Bush, president of the Bush Terminal company, has complete confidence in the members of the federal reserve board recently appointed by President Wilson on the Western Oregon coast.

"If the people of the coast counties will just get over the idea of wanting everything big and actually locate a number of colonies, it will be of tremendous value to Oregon."
