**USE ARMY IN STRIKE.**  
 Roosevelt Said He Would Have Used Troops in Pennsylvania.  
 (By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.)  
 NEW YORK, May 28.—Roosevelt, as President, was ready to take measures "equivalent to action in time of war" to end the great anthracite coal strike in 1902, even though the effort should be made to impeach him for it. Roosevelt so testified before the referee in the suit of Alexander T. Wales against President White of the United Mine Workers for fees alleged due for the part he took in settling the strike.

**LEFT BIG FORTUNE.**  
 Canadian Railroad Builder's Estate Amounts to Nearly \$30,000,000.

 LONDON, May 28.—The personal property left by Baron Strathcona and Mount Royal, known as the Canadian Empire builder, amounted to \$23,257,000. This was disclosed when probate was granted today. Together with the real property the estate is valued at \$27,928,000.

**LOGGER IS MURDERED.**  
 Found in Shanty with Head Split Open by Axe.

 SEATTLE, May 28.—Jack Minte, a logger, aged thirty-five, was found murdered in a shanty on the southern waterfront. His head was split open with an axe which lay near by. Minte was drinking last night in company with Jack Gunther, a logger, who is missing. Three suspects have been arrested for investigation.

 BERNE, Switzerland, May 28.—The Swiss federal government has decided that Switzerland should be officially represented at the Panama-Pacific Exposition, thus reversing its previous decision. A national pavilion will be built.

**AMMUNITION IS LANDED**  
 Steamer Ypiranga Brings Arms Into Port of Puerto, Mexico.

 WASHINGTON, D. C., May 28—Advices were received by the State Department from Consul Canada that the German steamer Ypiranga had landed ammunition today at Puerto Mexico.

Other official reports say that the steamer Bavaria of the same line also landed war munitions there a few days ago. Puerto Mexico is an open port, officials say, and no action is contemplated so far as can be learned.

**DROWNED IN ROGUE RIVER.**  
 Boy Falls Overboard and Drowns Near Gold Beach.  
 PORT ORFORD, Ore., May 28.—Frankie Dobbins, a boy of 12 years of age, who lived at Wedderburn, fell from a boat in which he was fishing and was drowned in Rogue River a few days ago. He was alone and it is supposed he tried to step from the skiff to a scow at the cannery wharf, lost his footing and fell overboard, coming up under the scow. The boy's hat and the skiff were noticed drifting away, and when a search was made the body was recovered. All efforts failed to resuscitate him.
