GYMNASIUM IS BADLY NEEDED

Marshfield Schools and Residents Will Be Greatly Aided—Election June 6.

It is expected that the \$10,000 bond issue proposition which will be submitted to the voters of this school district on Saturday, June 6, will carry by an overwhelming vote, as every patron of the school district realizes the necessity of securing a gymnasium. It is expected that the older students in the school will also take an interest in the election and see that their parents and friends turn out and vote in favor of the proposition and thus give the school board the moral support they need in carrying out such a matter. The election will be held at the Central school building from 2 to 7 o'clock in the afternoon.
 The Board of Education proposes to build a gymnasium 50 feet by 70 feet on the northeast corner of the high school grounds. The building will have a basement under the entire building, containing a swimming pool (20x40 ft.) for larger boys and girls; a wading pool (20x15 feet) for children; lockers, rubbing and dressing rooms for boys, lockers, booths and dressing room for girls; heating plant and fuel room; ample toilet facilities and shower baths.
 The gymnasium proper will contain a hardwood playing floor 40x70 feet.
 Construction ready for apparatus when same can be purchased; apparatus room; director's room, store room, bleachers.
 To pay for the gymnasium, the school board proposes to issue bonds to the amount of \$10,000, issued according to law by the Board of Education after being voted by the legal voters of the district.
 It is planned to open the gymnasium to the public at stated times each week by issuing tickets good for a definite time to residents. A definite price will be charged for these tickets which will permit all privileges of the gymnasium. The funds derived from tickets will be used for additional equipment.
Need of Gymnasium.
 The Marshfield schools need a gymnasium for the following reasons:
 1. It would perfect the school system. Regular physical exercise should and would become a part of the school's training like any other study, music, drawing, manual training, arithmetic, etc.
 2. Physical exercise is the natural preventative of bad habits.
 3. Physical exercise develops both body and mind.
 4. A school without competitive games never holds boys. These games on Coos Bay must be indoors. There is practically no school baseball and the football season is short. Where shall these games be played during the seven rainy months of the nine school months?
 5. The gain in self reliance from knowing "how to swim" is in itself a big asset. Swimming is a requirement for graduation in some colleges.
 6. The ability to save one's life and the lives of others is a big consideration in a section where the loss of life by drowning, to state it moderately, is large.
 7. Every boy will take recreation. Shall he be in proper surroundings or on the street. The gymnasium will solve this.
 8. It has cost the High School Athletic Association \$125 a year for the last four years to secure a building for the basketball season and then it was entirely lacking in accommodations.
 9. Schools and colleges over the entire country have compulsory physical exercise. In the University of Wisconsin and Pennsylvania compulsory physical exercise has been productive of a marked improvement in the general efficiency of students.
