SPECIAL ENTERTAINMENT NEXT FRIDAY EVENING TO RAISE FUNDS FOR PUBLIC LIBRARY

The entertainment which the North
Bend Library postponed in May on
account of so much sickness in the
city, will be given Friday evening,
June 12th at Loggie Hall. The en-
tertainment will consist of a mixed
program of unusual merit and the
proceeds will go to the book fund
now being raised for the public li-
brary.

Mrs. S. Calandar of Astoria, a well
known vocalist in Portland and As-
toria social circles, will render sev-
eral numbers. Mr. L. J. Simpson will
also sing, provided he is not called
away from home before that time. It
has been several years since a North
Bend audience has had the pleasure
of hearing Mr. Simpson sing in pub-
lic, although his many friends in
Portland and San Francisco testify
that he has not lost the art of vocal
charm, so this feature of the program
will be looked forward to with special
delight. Mr. Simpson and Mrs. Cal-

not yet promised definitely.

voice is so admirably adapted. Mrs.

generous and unflagging zeal in the
musical interest of the city, will ren-
der one or more baritone solos. Mr.
Kaiser's name and ability need no

lovers of music. It is hoped by the

Davenport will be able to give another
one of the excellent readings with
which she so delighted a former au-
dience gathered in the interests of
the book fund, but Mrs. Davenport is
at present and may have to forego
helping at this time, much to the re-
gret of all.

though in providing an evening of
perfect enjoyment, will be amply sup-
plied by Rev. Father McDevitt's in-
imitable story telling. Story telling
has been called the "new art" and
certainly the accomplishment may
well be called an art that few peo-
ple ever acquire. Father McDevitt is
an artist in story telling and the fun
and mirth he provokes are a mental,
moral and physical tonic such as
everybody needs and enjoys.
