SALOONS WANT TIME

Coquille Petitions Out for Six Months
Delay in Prohibition
The Coquille Herald says: "A pe-
tition is being circulated and quite
numerously signed, asking the City
Council, that, in consideration of
the state of the city finances, it re-
consider its recent action in refus-
ing to grant any more saloon li-
censes, and grant those asked for
for six months from July 1st. It is
argued that in the meantime a vote
will have been taken and the mat-
ter settled by ballot, and in any
case, it is only justice to the saloon
men to give them six months in
which to close up their businesses
with only a reasonable loss, which
is impossible in the three weeks
allowed by the late action of the
Council."

**TO CROSS OCEAN
BY AEROPLANE.**

Wanamaker Attempt to Cross At-
lantic Ocean in Air Craft Will
Be Made Next Month.
NEW YORK, June 19.—The at-
tempt to cross the Atlantic Ocean
by aeroplane, planned by the Rod-
man Wanamaker expedition, will be
made before July of this year has
passed. During next week it is ex-
pected that the airship will be as-
sembled at Hammondsport, N. Y.,
this to be followed by trial flights
over Lake Keuka. The plans in-
dicated call for the shipment of the
machine to St. Jons, N. F., late in
June or early in July, weather con-
ditions then to indicate the exact
date of departure. Lieutenant John
C. Porte, R. N., pilot of the expedi-
tion expects, however, to sail forth
on the trip at the earliest possible
date in July.
Recent tests proved engines sat-
isfactory, it is said, and plans for
the flight have since rapidly matur-
ed.
