PANAMA MONTE CARLO

English Snydicate Plans to Install Great Gambling Palace.

(By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.) LONDON, June 26 .- The "Casino Nacional de Panama Co., Limited," with the Earl of Shrewsbury and Talbot as chairman, which proposes to start a second Monte Carlo at Panama, gives an alluring descrip-tion of the wonderful gambling and amusement resort it intends to launch.

The company is to acquire 250 acres of land, and to operate under a charter "ensuring absolute free dom from all interference for a per-iod of twenty-five years," according to the promises of its prospectus, but no statement is made of what authority is to give the charter, and to insure the freedom from inter-ference. The casino is to include most of the attractions of Monte Carlo, a big hotel, an orchid garden which will be one of the wonders of the world, a bathing pavilion, pigeon shooting, tennis grounds, golf courses, and principally the gambgolf ling hall.

Panama is advertised as a splendid winter resort, while passengers will have 24 hours to spend on land while the steamers traverse the canal, thus insuring a constant pat-ronage. Profits to the stockholders must be large because the roulette tables will be run on a system giving the bank a much larger percentage of profits than the Monte Carlo Company gets from the play there. Forty per cent dividends on the four pound shares are predicted by the prospectus,
