**TO LIST LAND GRANT AGAIN**

Oregon Tax Commission Decides to Assess Ry. Holdings Until Court Decides

SALEM, Or., June 26.—Pending a decision by the United States Supreme Court in the Oregon & California R. R. land grant case, the lands involved in the grant will be assessed to the Oregon & California Railroad company, according to instructions sent by the State Tax Commission to the county assessors of the state. There are over 2,000,000 acres of these lands and the taxes last year amounted to approximately \$400,000. The railroad company has thus far refused to pay these 1913 taxes. Coos, Douglas and Lane counties have large tracts of these grant lands.

**RAIN AT ROSEBURG**

Half Inch of Water Falls in Less Than Ten Minutes. ROSEBURG, Or., June 26.—During a short period of about ten minutes, a local shower hit this vicinity and the way the rain fell was remarkable. One flash of lightning, a peal of thunder and then the deluge. Practically one-half inch of water fell in the brief time the shower lasted. The rain cloud came from the south and passed up the Deer Creek way over on to the North Umpqua.

**PANAMA MONTE CARLO**

English Syndicate Plans to Install Great Gambling Palace. (By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.) LONDON, June 26.—The "Casino Nacional de Panama Co., Limited," with the Earl of Shrewsbury and Talbot as chairman, which proposes to start a second Monte Carlo at Panama, gives an alluring description of the wonderful gambling and amusement resort it intends to launch.

The company is to acquire 250 acres of land, and to operate under a charter "ensuring absolute freedom from all interference for a period of twenty-five years," according to the promises of its prospectus, but no statement is made of what authority is to give the charter, and to insure the freedom from interference. The casino is to include most of the attractions of Monte Carlo, a big hotel, an orchid garden which will be one of the wonders of the world, a bathing pavilion, pigeon shooting, tennis grounds, golf courses, and principally the gambling hall.

Panama is advertised as a splendid winter resort, while passengers will have 24 hours to spend on land while the steamers traverse the canal, thus insuring a constant patronage. Profits to the stockholders must be large because the roulette tables will be run on a system giving the bank a much larger percentage of profits than the Monte Carlo Company gets from the play there. Forty per cent dividends on the four pound shares are predicted by the prospectus.
