afternoon. Judgment is expected to  
be rendered in about two weeks.

success in his wireless telephone ex-  
periment and is confident that trans-  
atlantic radiotelephony will be an  
accomplished fact at some not far  
distant day. He conducted experi-  
ments from the Duke of Abruzzi's  
flagship, the Regina Elena off Ag-  
osta, Sicily and succeeded in main-  
taining radio telephonic communi-  
cation with ships from 18 to 43 miles  
distant.  
In connection with his receivers  
Marconi has been using phonographic  
records and has succeeded in record-  
ing telephone signals from Gliden,  
early 2000 miles distant, and from  
Canada, 4100 miles away.
