WAR ON RATS IN NEW ORLEANS

Southern Officials Will Try to Prevent Spread of Bubonic Plague
 (By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.)
 NEW ORLEANS, La., July 1.—State and City Health authorities today inaugurated the first wholesale campaign in the history of the South for the extermination of rats. In order to prevent a spread of bubonic plague. Two cases of the disease were recently discovered in the home of the Volunteers of America. One man died, another is ill and twenty-eight were isolated. With the home as the nucleus of a zone extending four blocks in every direction, plans are for the construction of a concrete barrier around the entire area and for a rat drive toward the center.

ROUGH ON RATS IN MISSISSIPPI

Board of Health in Many Cities Fear They Will Infect Bubonic Plague
 (By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.)
 DES MOINES, Ia., July 1.—The boards of health in the cities along the Mississippi are expected today to take immediate action to exterminate rats and make bacteriological examinations, in accordance with the request of the sanitary engineer of the Iowa state board of health. It is feared that rats infected with the bubonic plague may have been brought north in boats.

NOTED TRIBE TO DISSOLVE

Cherokee Nation Will Divide \$600,000 Between 41,000 Members

 WASHINGTON, D. C., July 1.—The Cherokee nation, the largest of five civilized tribes, was dissolved as a nation at midnight, and tribal funds amounting to \$600,000 will be divided among 41,000 members.
