

JOURNALIST GOES TO PRISON

Was Convicted of Receiving Stolen Documents in Jap Naval Contract Scandal.

TOKIO, July 14.—Andrew M. Pooley, an English journalist, was sentenced today to two years' imprisonment and a fine of \$100 on the charge of receiving stolen documents in connection with the Japanese naval scandals involving officers in receipt of illicit commissions for influencing the allotment of contracts. Pooley is alleged to have used the documents for blackmailing.
