EFSENTIALS OF BREAD-MAKING.

OPEGON AGRICULTURAL COL-LEGE, CORVALLIS, Or., July 31.— Good bread can be made from ei-ther good hard wheat flour or from good soft wheat flour," says Dean Henrietta Calvin of the Oregon Ag-ricultural College, "but you should know which you are using because require different treatment. Hard wheat flour may be made into a soft dough, and if it is very hard wheat then the bread should be kneaded down several times. wheat flour should be made into a very stiff dough and the bread will tot need to rise more than once be-

fore it is put into the pans. "Home-made yeast is much better than the dry yeast. It can be likened to the seed saved by a gardener from his own healthy plants. When properly prepared it contains millions of live, growing, microscopic plants, Liquid yeast can be kept in a cool, dark place Liquid yeast about two weeks.

"Sweet milk is the best of all liquids for bread-making. It should be scalded and then cooled. The lero-organisms that cause sourness in milk are thus heated until they all die. Milk bread will be a little all die. yellow but its flavor is better and is mora nutritious than water bread. Water may be used instead of milk, however, and good bread be made with it

Sugar is a good yeast food. little added to the bread does not affect the fiavor of the bread but does quicken the action of the yeast, Salt is used for flavor. Such a small quantity as is used in bread does not materially retard the growth of the yeast but does whiten the bread.

"Bread, while rising, must not be kept too warm. More bread is spoiled by too much heat than by too little. Bread that feels warm to the hand is too warm. The bacteria which cause sourness, and are to the bread baker as weeds are to the gardener, grow rapidly in the dough if it is quite warm."

BUILD NEW TRAIL .

Schoffeld River and Loon Lake Cut-Off Is Planned.

The Eugene Register says: A crew of six men has been started at the work of building a trail in the Siuslaw national forest between the end of the road on Schofield River and Loon Lake by H. B. Rankin, supervisor, who has just returned from a trip to the reserve. The trail will be thirteen miles in length and extends southeasterly from the road at Scho-field River, connecting this road with the wagon road between Scottsburg and Allegany. It will be a convenience to the forestry employes as well as the settlers and public in general. It will require several weeks to complete the work.

Supervisor Rankin said yesterday that there are no fires to speak of in the Siuslaw forest, but one blaze was reported a few days ago from Camp creek, eight miles from Scottsburg. outside the reserve. This fire burned over a considerable area, but the supervisor was unable to ascertain to what extent, This fire was handled by the Coos and Douglas fire patrol association, an organization similar to the Western Lane association, the guards and patrolmen being paid by the owners of the timber lands lo-cated in those districts.

PLAN NEW COUNTY.

Petitions for Division of Lane Courty Are Being Circulated.

EUGENE, Or., July 30 .- Petitions asking for the creation of a new coun-ty out of the western end of Lane, are being circulated and, it is said, are receiving many signatures. The petitions will be filed in accordance with the 1913 law, which makes the creation of a new county a matter of local issue, to be voted upon in the territory affected alone.
