BIBLE QUOTED FOR WAR.

Russian Holy Synod Cites Christian Duty of Country.

ST. PETERSBURG, Aug. 6.—The Holy Synod sent today messages to the priests and congregations of the Orthodox Church throughout the empire quoting the text from the Book of John, "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friend," invoking them "to defend their little brothers and sisters in Christ," and declaring the faith is the invincible weapon.

CATSUP IS CONFISCATED.

Federal Authorities Invade Portland Restaurants.

PORTLAND, Or., Aug. 6.—Nearly a ton of tomato catsup shipped from San Francisco for Portland consumption was confiscated in restaurants this week. The seizures were all made in second-class eating houses. The District Attorney's office was working on instructions wired by Secretary of Agriculture D. F. Houston.

The condiment was shipped to Portland July 25 by the Pacific Preserve Company, of San Francisco, which has factories at San Leandro. A libel of condemnation, was filed with Assistant District Attorney Robert R. Rankin and Deputy United States Marshals George Jackson and Dave Fuller were dispatched on the case.

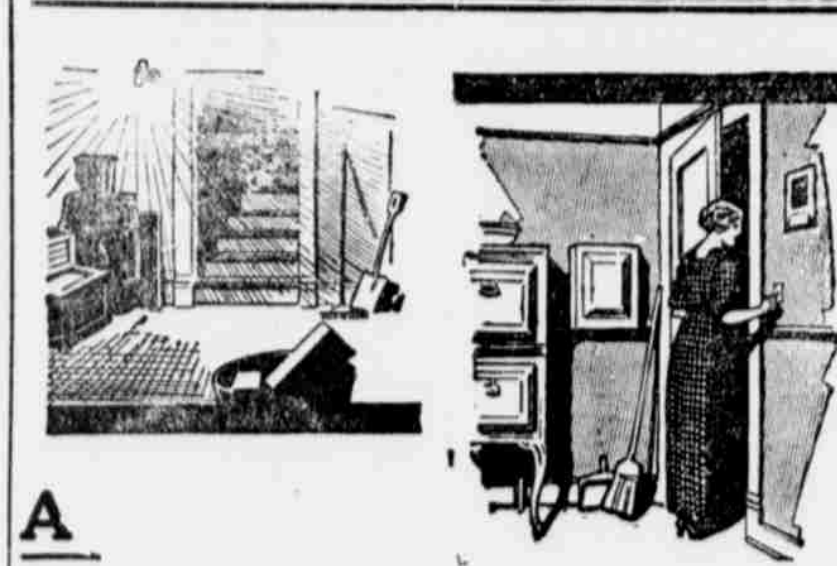
