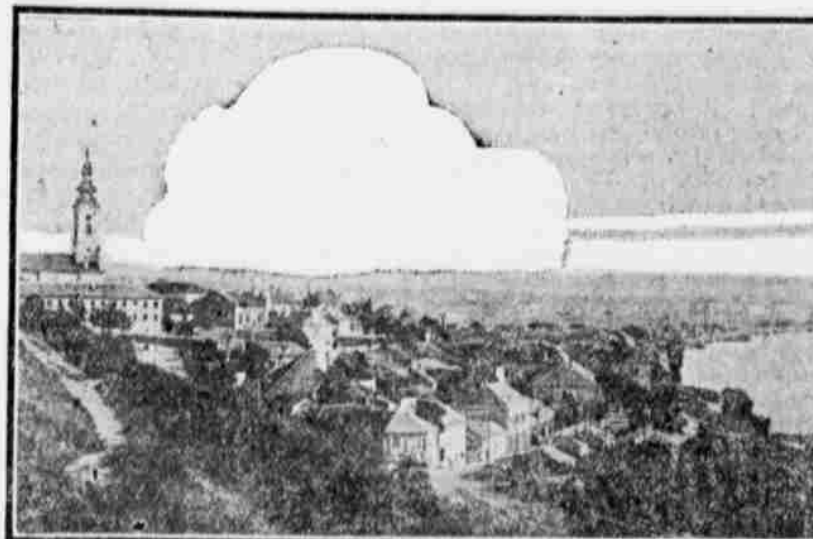

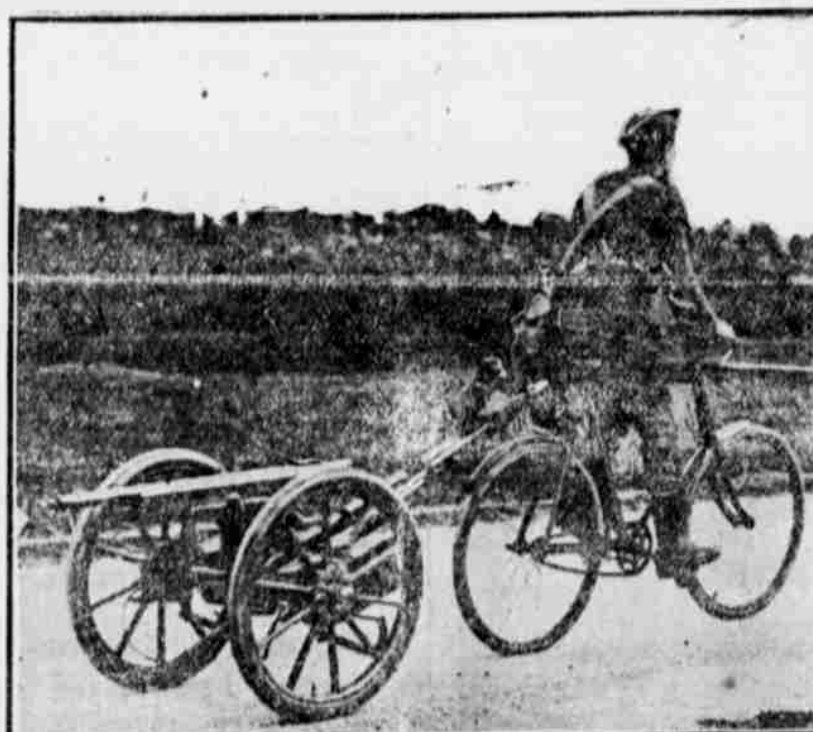

Servia maintains only 36,000 men in times of peace, but she has mobilized all of her male population trained to bear arms, and the number is 324,000 men. The Servian army is largely composed of veterans with a splendid morale and a record of first rate achievement in the Balkan wars.

This map shows Austria-Hungary and Servia, with surrounding countries. It is in this section of Europe that the principal war action centers. Vienna is the capital of Austria, and Belgrade is the capital of Servia.

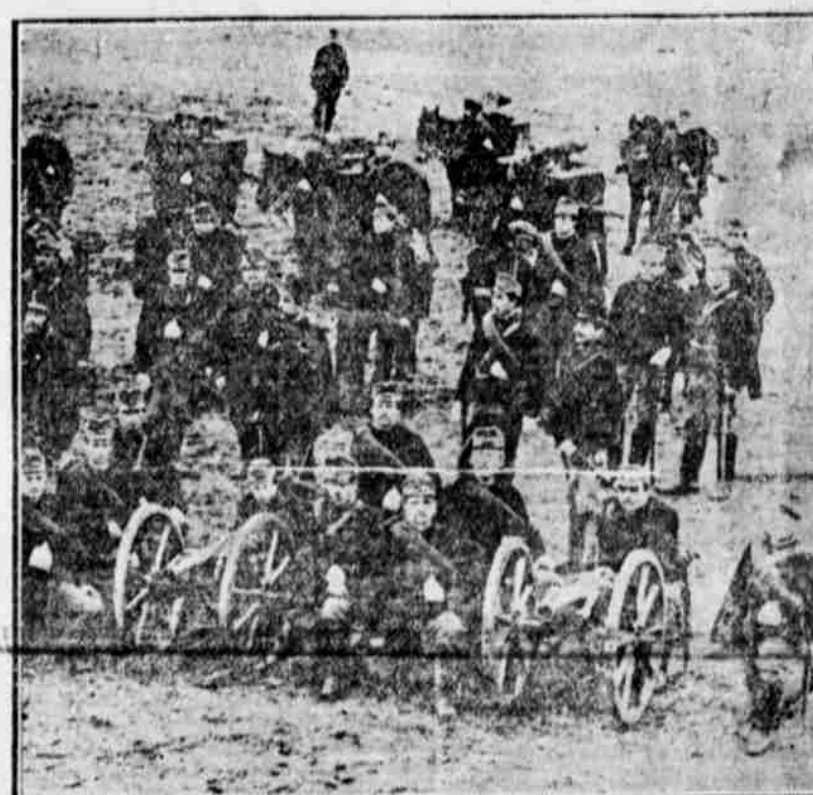

Austrian Mountain Gun Detachment

In the conflict between Austria and Servia a great deal of the fighting will be in the mountains. Neither country has a first class navy, and the armies will be depended on for victory. In this picture there is shown a number of the Austrian mountain guns. These are manned by efficient corps of soldiers, about six men to each gun.
