'Our adversaries, however, are calous of the successes of our work and there has been latent hostility to the east and the west and beyoud the seas.

This has been borne by us till now, as we were aware of our responsibility and our power.
"Now, however, these adversaries

wish to humiliate us, asking that we should look on with folded arms and watch our enemies prepare themledves for the coming attack.

They will not suffer that we maintain our resolute fidelity to our ally who is fighting for her position as a great power and with whose humiliation our power and honor would be equally lost. "So the sword must decide.

"In the midst of perfect peace the enemy surprises us. Therefore, to
