FRANCE STARTS OUT NEW ARMY

LONDON, Aug. 29.—According to an unconfirmed report France has formed a new army of a quarter of a million men to take the offensive against the German right.

OPEN ATTACK ON CATTERO

LONDON, Aug. 29.—A dispatch from Milan says a report has reached there that British and French warships, combined with Montenegrin guns, resumed bombardment of the Austrian forts at Cattaro Thursday night. Two forts were demolished after six hours of cannonading.

NEUTRAL LAWS TO BE GIVEN

T. H. Barry today received a letter from the U. S. War Department telling him of the procedure in case a foreign vessel put into this port, this morning.

Mr. Barry is also in receipt of a letter from Collector of Customs Burke, instructing him to compile data on the shipping of Coos Bay and near-by harbors.

"I beg to call your attention to the fact that at the present time the clearance of vessels coastwise is not required at ports in your district, and in view of this fact no official record giving the amount of tonnage being moved from the various places in your district is obtainable."

A book suitably ruled has been forwarded to you for keeping this record, and, as stated before, keep all transactions of each locality separate in order that the information may be ready available for each point without trouble.

I would suggest that this record start from the 1st of July, 1914, the commencement of this fiscal year, and I am sure that the various interests in each of these localities will give the necessary information that you may start the record from that date.
