# FREE TRAINS CARRY FRENCH FROM PARIS TO OTHER CITIES

PARIS, Sept. 4 .- Tens of thousands of Parisians, chiefly women and children, have taken advantage of free trains placed at their disposal by the government for the purpose of clearing Paris and its environs of civilians who might hamper military operations. Most of these people are going south or west. The military government has given non-combatants 15 trains of 25 cars each. They will run today, tomorrow and Sunday, conveying refugees to points outside of the military zone. ### GERMAN ADVANCE IS RAPID

LONDON, Sept. 4 .- The Times' correspondent at Dieppe, France, under Thursday's date, indicates that the Germans are less than twenty-five miles from Paris. He says: "All day yesterday, the German right was furiously forcing its way toward Paris, battering at the rear of the retreating French through Creil, Senlis and Cropy En Valis. The cannonading broke windows in Chantilly, seventeen miles north of Paris. The Germans are also near Seissons." Another dispatch to The Times from Beauvais, forty miles northwest of Paris, says the Germans entered Cleimont, thir-ly-five miles from Paris, at seven o'clock Wednesday morn-ing. At the same time their cavalry was operating around Beauvais.
