**Corn Roast.**—The L. T. L. Society will give a corn roast at the Sand Hills Friday evening. The Alice H. has been chartered for the occasion and will leave from the Market street dock at 7:15. Everybody invited.

**Leaves Today.**—Coy Elliston, who was arrested as a suspect in the Gardner robbery and who was later held up at Empire, left on the Nann Smith today for California, evidently fearing that the grand jury would prosecute him up for gambling. His pal, Trotter, left this morning for Gardner.

**Wants Bloodhound.**—Officer Doane is advocating that Coos County purchase a good bloodhound for use in tracing criminals. He points out that in nearly every case recently a good dog could have been put on the trail and chased down the holdup men within a few hours. Smith promised to appear before the grand jury, but as soon as he had cleared up he cleared out on the Redondo.
