## NEW COUNTY MAY RISE

Petitioners Would Create "Siuslaw" From Lane,

EUGENE, Or., Oct. 6.—Petitions asking for information of "Siuslaw" County, taking 800 square miles of the timbered and Coast territory from Western Lane County were filed with the Lane County Clerk bearing sufficient names to place the issue upon the November ballot.

The proposed county will embrace virtually all the territory in Lane County west of the Coast mountains and will be 40 miles long by 30 miles wide. Its assessed valuation is approximately \$5,000,000 and its population is estimated at 2000.

It will include, near its eastern boundary, the towns of Blackley, Hale, Walton and Alma. The line runs between Long Tom, Richardson, Chesire, Spencer and Coyote precincts on the east and Lane,. Walton, and Mound on the west. Mound pre-cinct is partly divided by the line.
