**ELECTION NOTICE**  
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that it is proposed to Annex to and include within the corporate boundary lines of the City of Eastside, in Coos County, Oregon, all that territory in said County and State, embraced within the following described boundaries, to-wit:

Beginning at a point which is the North-west corner of the boundary of the corporate limits of the City of Eastside, said point being the intersection of the mid-channel streams of Coos Bay and Coos River in Coos County, Oregon; running thence North-easterly to a point on the Harbor line as established by the Port of Coos Bay, which point is on the east side of the channel of Coos Bay and on the north side of the Coos River channel; thence Northwesterly along the Harbor line as established by said Port of Coos Bay to a point due west of the Meander post on the East shore of Coos Bay on the line between Sections 12 and 13, Township 25 South, Range 13 West W. M.; thence East to the quarter section corner between said Sections 12 and 13; thence North one-fourth mile to the North-west corner of the Plat of Port-lawn Addition to the City of North Bend; thence East one-fourth mile; thence South 22 1/2 feet, more or less, to the North-west corner of the Plat of Crawford Point Addition to the City of Coos Bay; thence East, one-fourth mile to the North-east corner of said Plat of Crawford Point Addition to the City of Coos Bay; thence South along the East boundary line of the said plat to the North-west corner of Section 19, Township 25 South, Range 12 West, W. M.; thence East one-half mile to the north quarter section corner of said Sec. 19, which point is the North-east corner of the Plat of Tozier Heights; thence South three-fourths mile, more or less, to the North-west corner of the Plat of Bay View Addition to Millcoma; thence East one-fourth mile along the North boundary line of said Bay View Addition to Millcoma; thence along the East line of said Bay View Addition to Millcoma, South one-fourth mile to a point on the South boundary line of said Section 19, which point is the South-east corner of the said Plat of Bay View Addition to Millcoma; thence West along the South boundary line of Section 19, to the Meander Post on the East shore of Coos Bay; thence South 60 degrees West to the mid-channel of Coos River; thence upstream along the mid-channel of Coos River to a point on the South boundary of Section 30, Township 25 South Range 12 West W. **LOSSES OF OFFICERS**  
**WORRY THE BRITISH**

LONDON, Oct. 8.—The military correspondent of The Times writes as follows:  
"An army cannot be improvised at a moment's notice and instances in which improvisation has been attempted in the past have been lamentable failures. Experienced officers are dubious concerning the they will be ready to fight in the field for eighteen months and then only if they have been trained by good professional officers, the numbers of which are limited and are being constantly decreased by losses in action."  
"The question of officers is a serious one. An examination of our casualty lists show we have lost already over eleven hundred officers in killed, wounded or missing. This is two out of every five officers those at the front."  
"More officers is the constant cry from the front and several hundred have been sent but obviously this cannot be kept up forever and each officer sent is one less instructor for the new troops. We must not allow ourselves to become megamaniacs and place in the field regiments which are unfit to defend the honor of our armies."
