**SCHEDULES FOR YEAR ARE MADE**

Representatives from Marshfield, North Bend, Coquille, Myrtle Point and Bandon high schools met this morning at the county seat and there effected a schedule for the school contests, both in athletics and debates, for the entire year.

Superintendent F. A. Tiedgen, of the city schools, Coach Niles and Herbert Bradley went as representatives from Marshfield to meet with Supt. A. G. Raab and Harold Simpson of North Bend, Supt. H. L. Hopkins and two students from Bandon, Supt. C. A. Howard and two students from Coquille, and two students from Myrtle Point.

Superintendent of City Schools C. A. Howard, of Coquille, was elected president of the Coos county High School Teachers' Association and Principal Waite, of Marshfield, received the office of vice president.

That football will not be played this year in the regular high school athletic league, is the statement of Mr. Raab, of North Bend, who declares the various schools have not enough students and enthusiasm to put out such teams. It is highly probable that special games will be arranged outside the league by the Marshfield high school team with some of the surrounding towns.

The basketball season will open early in January, lasting two months. Each team in the league will meet the others for at least two games.

To Marshfield was given the date for the county track and field meet. This will be some time in May, though the date is not yet definite. The annual oratorical and declamatory contest will be held in North Bend in April.

Arrangements were made for the annual county debate. Each school in the league will place two teams, an affirmative and negative, in the field, each team to consist of two or three members, according to the agreements between the schools debating. The question, as chosen by the state high school debate committee, will be "Government Ownership of Railroads."
