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GERMANY ASSUMES OFFENSIVE, NAVAL ACTIVITY IS EXPECTED

London Announces That Kaiser is Prosecuting Campaign Everywhere With Renewed Vigor—English Expect German Fleet to Aid Land Troops.

RUSSIAN CRUISER PALLADA SUNK WITH 568 MEN IN BALTIC SEA BY GERMAN SUBMARINE

English Fleet in North Sea Prepares Against Attacks of German Submarines—Unexpected Activity Surprises English Military Experts

LONDON, Oct. 13.—In every theater of war, Germany evidently is resuming the offensive with unparalleled vigor, and British naval observers are inclined to expect some co-operative display or activity by the German fleet.

Russia, on October 2, suffered her most severe marine loss in the sinking of the cruiser Pallada, torpedoed by a German submarine in the Baltic, according to a Russian official announcement, which acknowledged that all hands, numbering 568, were lost. The English fleet in the North Sea is taking precautions against submarine attacks.

RUSSIANS CLAIM BIG VICTORY

LONDON, Oct. 13.—A dispatch from Petrograd says: "It is evident that a big battle was fought near the village of Ravzki. After a defeat by the Germans, the German right wing rested. On October 8, the Russians, after seven days of fighting, drove the Germans across the river and posted their guns on hills. Several batteries were captured."

FRENCH CLAIM ALLIES WINNING EVERYWHERE EXCEPT NEAR LILLE

PARIS, Oct. 13.—The following announcement was issued this afternoon: "On our left wing, our forces resumed the offensive in the regions of Hazebrouck and Bethune, against the enemy composed of a large part of cavalry coming from the front along Bailleul, and Labasse. The town of Little, held by a territorial detachment, has been attacked and occupied by a German army corps. Between Arras and Albert we have made notable progress. On the center also we made progress in the region of Berry Au Bac, and have advanced toward Souay, in West Argonne.

Between the Argonne and Meuse Rivers, on the right bank of the Meuse, our troops, who are east of Verdun have advanced."

To the south of the road from Verdun to Metz, in the region of Apremont, we have gained a little territory on our right and repulsed a German attack on our left. In the Vosges and Alsace, there is no change.

KAISER WILHELM CANAL CLOSED

BOSTON WINS CHAMPIONSHIP BY DEFEATING PHILADELPHIA 3 TO 1 IN FOURTH GAME TODAY
