

SUPT. MILLER RETURNS HERE

Head of Local Southern Pacific Lines Says Republican Victory Will Help Business

Supt. W. F. Miller of the local Southern Pacific returned yesterday from a trip to Portland, San Francisco and eastern Oregon, where he went to meet Mrs. Miller, who is returning from a trip to Nebraska. While away he was conferring with head officials regarding matters here.

"Business is rather quiet on the outside, the coming election apparently injuring trade as much as the war is," said Mr. Miller. There is a general belief that Republican victories at the polls will help business. It is probable that Oregon will give a substantial Republican majority all along the line.

"The road to Mapleton should be completed by next Monday. Contractors are rushing the work everywhere. In considerably less than a year, we should have train service into Coos Bay.

"Today the Breakwater brought in about twenty-five workmen for the contractors. About 1000 tons of bridge steel is lying on the wharf at Oakland for shipment here and this will be brought in as soon as the bridge progresses far enough to require it.

"Mr. Mills is well but very busy and wished to be remembered to his friends here. Mrs. Mills has not been very well lately. Her sister, Mrs. Robinson, is there from New York to spend the winter and Miss Edna Lewis is also visiting them. Rev. and Mrs. Shiers, the latter being formerly Miss Mabel Mills, are in Jerome, Ariz.

"I cannot give out anything relative to our proposed train schedule over the new Smith-Powers line south of Myrtle Point until I have taken it up with Mr. Powers."

NEW RULING ON JUDGES TERMS

Attorney General Crawford Hands Down Opinion Keeping Nineteen in Office

SALEM, Ore., Oct. 29.—Attorney General Crawford gave an important verbal opinion today on the 1919 constitutional amendment, fixing the terms of all judges at six years, which if upheld by the Supreme Court may make the election of county judges in nineteen counties on November 2 invalid. Litigation, at least, is sure to follow the election.

He held first that all county judges elected simultaneously with the passage of the amendment in 1919 shall hold office for six years; secondly, that where a vacancy had been created since election in the county judge-ship by resignation or death, and a successor had been appointed, such appointee shall hold office until the first general election after his appointment, and thirdly, that if, since 1919, a recall election had been held, the candidate who received the highest vote is deemed elected for the remainder of the term of the judge recalled.

According to the ruling, only in the second instance will the election of a county judge on November 3 be valid. In the other two instances the names of nominees should be removed from the ballot. On account of lack of time, however, this cannot be done.
