

Practically every town in the country with the exception of Lakeside, went dry,

Two precincts in North Bend where the count was completed this afternoon, went" dry by a considerable majority and the count in the others indicated North Bend would be dry.

Marshfield is running fairly close, but some of the election officials said that the final count would show Marshfield between 100 and 200 dry.

Coquille was reported going dry at the rate of four to one. Bandon gave a dry majority of about 200.

Eastside went dry. Empire divided even and South Slough

In the Coos River precinct where the Blue Ridge Tigers vote, there was an overwhelming dry majority, and it was said that out of the 76 Blue Ridge Tigers voting, only one voted wet,

The South Central Marshfield precinct alone will, it is estimated from the incomplete count, give a majority of between seventy-five and eighty for the drys.






