NEW MALADY IN LONDON

LONDON, Nov. 5.—"Zeppelia neck" is a form of malady now prevalent in London. This popular term for stiff necks, which are commoner than ever this season, because so many Londoners are craning their necks scanning the heavens, as the searchlights relentlessly examine the sky for the enemy. The City Temple, one of London's best known churches, is insured against bombs, according to the admissions of its own officers, but it is only one of a number of houses of worship that have taken out policies with a view to possible damage by Zeppelins. Thousands of American attend services in the City Temple when visiting London. Its minister is R. J. Campbell, one of the best known clergymen in this country.

WATSON'S PLIGHT.

Considerable consternation and discussion was aroused by the word passed around last week that it had been discovered that a constitutional amendment passed in 1910 lengthened the terms of all judges elected that year to six years. This would leave County Judge John F. Hall two more years in office, and leave James Watson and J. J. Stanley, who have been fighting to succeed him, pawing an empty void. In Watson's case, especially, it would seem to be a disconcerting joke, for he relinquished the nomination for county clerk, which he might have had without question, for that of judge. It would seem to be an excellent plan for the voters to express their preference, just the same, and then if Judge Hall should resign which may reasonably be expected the candidate polling the larger vote today could be appointed to succeed him—if that wouldn't be too reasonable and common sense a way of conducting politics. In the meantime we may wonder why some of the state's wise lawyers didn't discover all this before.—Coquille Herald.

GERMANS SHOW BRITISH NO QUARTER

Feeling is Bitter Between British and German Soldiers—Germans and French Are More Cordial.

BRUSSELS, via London, Oct. 29.—Evidence is reaching here daily of the extremely bitter feeling of the German soldier against the British. Wherever the Germans oppose the British, the fighting is reported to be incessant.

Between the Germans and the French there is a more cordial feeling. Near Courtrai the French soldiers in the trenches signaled a message to the opposing German soldiers:

"This is our Colonel's birthday."

The Germans passed the word along the trenches and replied:

"We won't shoot much today; let the Colonel enjoy the day."

The Germans at Liege, Namur and Antwerp were busily engaged in restoring the fortifications and repairing guns spiked by the Belgians. A considerable number of Germans have been killed at Liege while testing the guns thus repaired.

GERMANY TO KEEP SUGAR CROP AT HOME

German Government to Regulate the Export of Sugar So That Great Part of Crop Will Be Available for Home Use

BERLIN, Nov. 5.—It is semi-officially stated that the government has decided to regulate the exportation of sugar in such a manner that the greater part of the crop will be kept in the country for domestic consumption. The government had intended to permit the free exportation of sugar, but changed its mind owing to the advice of leading agriculturists, who opposed free exportation on the ground that sugar is needed for the nourishment of the people.

CONVINCED THAT WAR WILL BE LONG ONE

German Press Talks of an Indefinite Struggle—Germany Has Sufficient Foodstuffs to Last Until Next Harvest

LONDON, Nov. 5.—"The German semi-official press has now changed its mind and admits the war is likely to last longer than it was originally thought," says Reuter's Amsterdam correspondent. "The North German Gazette," the correspondent continues, "in a long article regarding the maximum prices of provisions urges the necessity to husband the wheat resources. The newspaper estimates that Germany has sufficient corn for bread for the army and the population until the next harvest, but it adds that the war may last longer and that the Germans must be able to hold out until a lasting peace is secured."

WAR BILL NOW BEING MET BY NATIONS INVOLVED IN STRUGGLE

PARIS, (Correspondence of The Associated Press.)—The war bill which Europe is meeting daily is now figured up as follows:

The French appropriations are from official figures as announced by M. Ribot, Minister of Finance; the English estimate by the London Statist; the German total from "an authoritative source" in a Geneva paper; and the other sums from various conservative estimates which have appeared in one place or another. The item "various" represents the probable expense to which Serbia, Belgium and the neutral countries of Switzerland, Italy, Rumania, Turkey, Greece, Holland and Denmark have been put.

The vast total does not include the destruction of property where fighting is taking place nor the well nigh incalculable losses to Europe of 20,000,000 men under arms being taken from production. There are no indications that exhaustion has set in, but it is evident that the accumulated treasure of even the richest country on the continent is being poured out at a rate that adds \$200,000,000 a month to the National debt.

ENGLISH WILL NOT SING GERMAN HYMNS

List is Prepared to Help Clergy Avoid Those Written by German Authors—Many Old and Fine Hymns to be Banned

LONDON, — (Correspondent of The Associated Press.)—To enable the British clergy to recognize made-in-Germany hymns, a list of them has been prepared by The Guardian, a church newspaper, which has opened its columns to a discussion of the propriety of using these hymns in the English service.

If German hymns were banned, the English hymnal would be deprived of some of its oldest and most popular numbers. Luther's famous version of the forty-sixth Psalm, "A Sure Stronghold our God is He," would be perhaps the most regretted of all excisions. Other familiar numbers of German origin are: "Hark, the Herald Angels Sing," "Sun of My Soul, My Saviour Dear," "Christ Whose Glory Fills the Skies," "As With Gladness Men of Old," "Christ the Lord is Risen Again," "We Plough the Fields and Scatter," "Hail to the Lord's Anointed," "Oh Happy Band of Pilgrims."

Since the Wagner nights excite as much enthusiasm as ever in the Queen's Hall concerts, it is not believed that the agitation against German hymns will find a strong following.
