A Three-minute Sermon  
"Thou'lt bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and have not charity, it profiteth me nothing."—1 Corin. 13:13.  
What St. Paul means is, that no

He measures your munificence, not by your gift, but by your sympathy. I have read in the Acts that he set up in Heaven a monument to Cornelius for his charitable PRAYERS. The man who gets the grandest monument in Heaven is the man whose love goes beyond his contributions. However big his contributions be, his love must go beyond.
