SUMMONS.

In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon, in and for the County of Coos. Home Mortgage Co., a corporation, Plaintiff, vs. Eugene Arthur Hermida, Defendant.

Judgment in favor of plaintiff against the said defendant for the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars with interest therein at the rate of ten per cent per annum from the 24th day of September, 1913, and fifty dollars as attorney fees, together with plaintiff's costs and disbursements in this suit, and also a decree that plaintiff's mortgage described in the complaint is the first and prior lien upon the premises hereafter described, and decreeing a foreclosure and sale of all his right, title and interest and of all persons claiming by, through or under him, in and to lot four of block eight and lot seven of block three of the town of South Marshfield, Coos County, Oregon, and lot thirty-eight of block twenty-six of Railroad Addition to Marshfield, Coos County, Oregon, according to the plats thereof of record and on file in the office of the County Clerk of Coos County, Oregon; and that the proceeds of said sale be applied to the costs of making said sale and the sum found to be due plaintiff therein and his costs and disbursements in said suit, and that the over-plus, if any there be, be paid into court to abide the further order thereof.

NEWS OF WORLD'S GREATEST WAR DAY BY DAY

MOTHER OF KING GEORGE

Kaiser Was Invited to Birthday. But War Annulled Celebration.

LONDON, Dec. 23.—Plans of King George for a great celebration of the seventieth birthday of his mother, Queen Alexandra, were entirely set aside this year, on account of the war, and she spent the day quietly.

COPPER IS RELEASED.

ROME, Dec. 26.—England and France have given assurances to the Italian government that cargoes of copper on board Italian steamers, which have been held as contraband of war will be released.

BANKS IN CHINA.

PEKING, Dec. 24.—China has started a government, or national savings bank, but as the poor people are not accustomed to depositing their money for safe keeping anywhere but in the ground and the rich are accustomed to the extortion of large interest, the inducement of a lottery has been added to the banking scheme.

Queen Alexandra still is active in public affairs. She is a firm believer in outdoor exercise and whenever the morning weather is favorable she may be seen strolling through her gardens with her favorite dogs.

She is the head of the Red Cross society of England and has devoted much time to the raising of funds for the support of this work. She follows the labors of the nurses at the front with the closest interest, and is preparing to send each of them at Christmas a small personal gift.

SINK FRENCH SUBMARINE.

ROME, Dec. 26.—According to a newspaper report, a French submarine belonging to the fleet of Vice Admiral Laperyre has been sunk while attempting to torpedo the Austrian battleships in the Austrian naval base off Pola. The crew was rescued and taken prisoners.

CHRISTMAS DAY ON BATTLE LINE

Germans and Allies in Tacit Truce Exchanged Greetings and Presents

LONDON, Dec. 26.—Not since the Christian era began has there been so many armed men within gun fire of each other as the dawn of Christmas yesterday found on Europe's battle fields.

Each country at war had exerted every effort to remember bountifully their soldiers in the trenches, in the hospitals and in camp, and the few brief messages that came from the front during the day indicated that almost along the entire line in the Western arena, tacit truce prevailed.

The official French statement claimed small advances made at numerous points Thursday, indicating a determined offensive all along the line of progress. North of Mesnil the statement says the French took possession of a forest strongly fortified by the enemy, and to the northwest of Mesnil and east of Perthes are now masters of all the German front line of defense.

The Germans claim advances were made Thursday at points which conflict with the French statement. In Russia, the French statement asserted the Germans were hurled back from certain positions which they occupied on the right bank of the Lower Baura, but they had been re-occupied at another point.

PIPES CHRISTMAS GIFTS TO TROOPS

Crown Prince Sends Special Greetings With Small Token to Each Soldier in Army

BERLIN, Dec. 26.—The Crown Prince issued the following message to his troops in the field: "The celebration of Christmas in enemy. Such a celebration none of us are likely to forget. I wish for all members of my brave army the blessings of God until we have with the good luck of the dutiful soldier established a peace of which we and our beloved fatherland may be proud.

Christmas Late in Russia. Difference in Calendar Makes Celebration There 13 Days Later. PETROGRAD, Dec. 26.—While all the western world is celebrating Christmas, the Russian goes blandly about his business, still having thirteen days in which to do Christmas shopping. This is due to the Julian calendar, which sets back Russian time nearly a fortnight behind the rest of Christendom.
