BRIDGE CLUB.

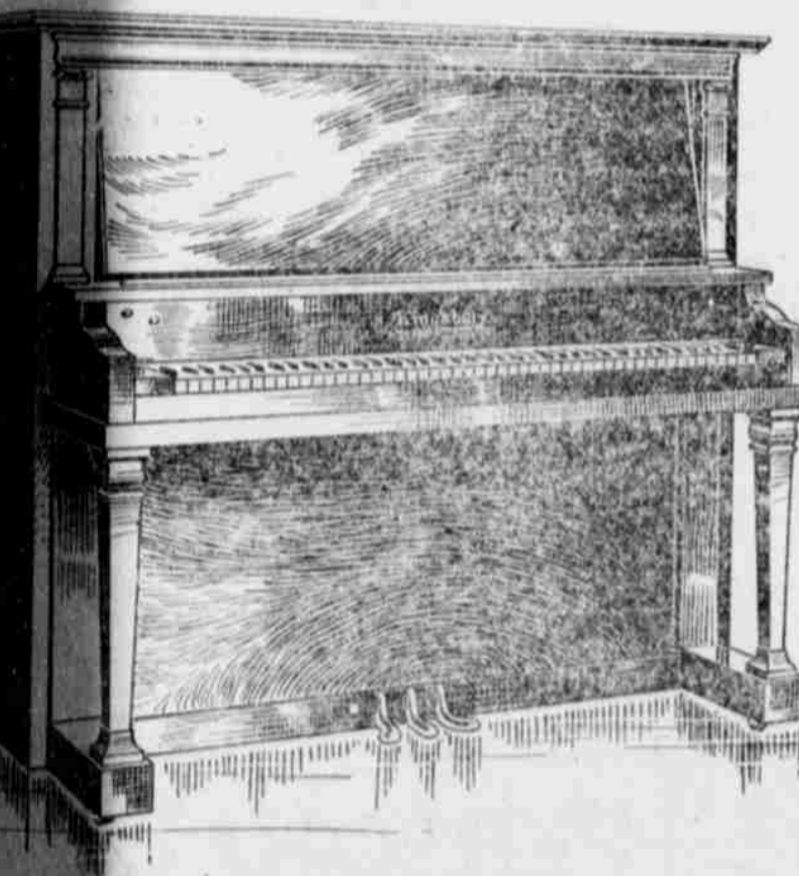
