SHIPMENTS TO SAN FRANCISCO MARKETS CONTINUE LARGE

More Than Three Million Feet in Excess of Any Other Coast Port During the First Half of Month.

ASTORIA PORT BONDS.

The Port of Astoria Commission has decided to accept the bid of 59 1/2 cents submitted by the Detroit Trust Company for the purchase of \$100,000 in Port bonds drawing interest at the rate of 5 per cent. This acceptance was with the proviso that the bidders furnish the blank bonds and pay accrued interest from the date of issue to the time of delivery.

BANDON SCHOOL BOND

Believing that the school district finances as far as warrants are concerned, should be placed on a firmer basis, the school board has called an election to be held the afternoon of March 30th for the purpose of voting on a proposed bond issue, amounting to \$14,200. The bonds if voted, will be divided as follows: \$12,202 for retiring outstanding interest bearing general school warrants and \$1,998 for retiring warrants issued for building the East-side school. The warrants that are to be retired bear 5 per cent interest.—Bandon World.
