CURE FOR SOREHEAD

WHILE The Times does not conduct a regular queries and answers column, every now and then some one writes asking answers to some question. Recently a reader propounded one by asking a cure for a sorehead. This is a complaint which is one of the stages in the development of a "knocker." It is found in many neighborhoods and in mildly contagious, but is more virulent in some sections than in others. The victim is practically worthless for community purposes. Sometimes a bad case will spread rather rapidly. It passes from case to case—through contact in conversation, business dealings, public meetings and otherwise. The cure is rather easy. If the victim will seek out some neighbor and do him a good turn it will always help. If the favor can be done in a whole hearted way to another victim of sorehead and especially to a person who harbors a feeling of soreheadedness toward the deer of the good and neighborly deed, so much the better—two cases will be benefitted instead of one. The best remedy is to take a systematic course of helping to make the community a better place in which to live. Giving up something selfishly desired, like having your own way about some public policy or project intended for communal betterment is very good in allaying the irritation of the cranium. A man who will put himself in the other fellow's place and try to follow the golden rule is always benefitted. Another beneficial treatment is to attend all public meetings of your fellow citizens and serve on one or two committees for the purpose of accomplishing some public good. A bad case of sorehead often comes from defective brooding in solitude—brooding over the victim's own real or fancied grievances. Association in a broad-minded way with one's fellows, and brooding over ways to make life better for every one in the sovereign remedy, with the Golden Rule as the manual and guide book of life. Try it and see.
