ASK BETTER ROADS JITNEY TO WAGNER

THREE DISTRICTS IN COUNTY ARE OUTLINED

Good Roads Committee of Chamber of Commerce Seeks Meeting With County Court

Advancing a plan for the abolishment of the 33 road districts within the county, but calling for three large districts united under one head the Good Roads committee of the Chamber of Commerce yesterday afternoon passed resolutions to be forwarded to the county court asking that no money be appropriated for roadwork between Coos Bay and Coquille until the committee has had a chance to consult with the commissioners.

That \$250,000 is being expended annually on the county roads was a fact pointed to with alarm by the committeemen by reason of the fact that none of the highways are what they termed permanent. Crushed rock, said the members, is a poor road substance when used on the wearing surface, especially when it is of the soft rock found in this county.

Plans for a concrete road uniting the principle cities of the county were advanced, discussed and labeled as reasonable and not wild cat.

Dr. E. E. Straw, newly elected chairman of the committee, stated that \$417,000 has already been spent on the road between Coquille and Myrtle Point and more must be put in this year, again next year, and so on "ad finitum."

"As long as this county is divided up into 33 road districts and each district has a supervisor, appointed for only his one little section—as long as this details we are going to have poor roads." He said the expenditure of the county road money should be put under the management of one good manager. The present county law provides for these districts. A change of the law could be made only by petition next November.

It was on this suggestion that he plan of three large road districts was advanced. They would take in a Ten Mile district, Coos Bay district and a Coquille district. The work could be done under the supervision of one man. In this way, they believe business-like methods could be used and something accomplished with a degree of permanency.

No criticism was made of former methods; the results were laid to the fact that no one has really comprehended putting the road expenditure in one big project.

Next County Court Given a chance to meet with the county court the committee expressed the opinion these plans could be talked over and some definite conclusion reached, at least for the Coquille road and its expense during this year.

The committee asks that no money be appropriated until such meeting. "We have spent years and thousands of dollars," said Steward Lyons, "and we haven't a road yet. This year we will have to do something desperate."

A hard surface concrete road was approved. The members declared that an education of the voters will have to take place before anything definite can be done.
