Notice of Delinquent Taxes

FOR THE YEAR 1913

In accordance with Chapter 275

of the 1911 General Laws of Oregon,

and amended by Chapter 301 of the

1913 General Laws of Oregon, and

which is in substance as follows:

Section 1. Four months after date when taxes charged against Real Property are delinquent, the tax collector shall cause to be published

one each week for four successive weeks in the newspaper or news-

paper selected by the County Court

or public County Court Proceedings

Under the provisions of Section 2902

of Ladd Oregon Laws, a notice stat-

ing a description of the several par-

ties of Real Property upon which

taxes are delinquent, the amount of

taxes, and the name of the owner, if

known upon the tax roll, and a state-

ment that six months after such taxes

are delinquent a tax certificate of

delinquency will issue therein, as pro-

vided by law. Such notice shall be

published for a price not exceeding

seventy-five cents prescribed by Section 2903

of Ladd Oregon Laws. The tax col-

lector shall forthwith cause to be

posted a copy of the printed notice in

his public places in this county for

four weeks, commencing four months

after the date when such taxes be-

came delinquent, and shall file in the

office of the County Clerk of his

county, a copy of such notice, with a

certificate endorsed thereon, setting

forth that such notices had been post-

ed in four public places in his coun-

ty heretofore provided; provid-

ed, however, that in counties of less

than one hundred inhabitants, the County

Court of said Counties, sitting for

County Business, shall cause said de-

livery tax list to be published in

all newspapers, having a circulation

of more than ten thousand (10,000)

outside, sworn and ascertained cir-

culation, which newspapers shall be

published and circulated in said

county, and that each newspaper so

published, shall be compensated as

stated in the notice, with two cents

for each one thousand

of one thousand dollars and ascertained

general circulation, said column to be

not less than two inches wide; pro-

vided further, that the provisions of

the act shall not apply where the

amount of taxes delinquent against

any parcel of Real Property is less

than one dollar (\$1.00).

Section 2. The neglect or failure

of the tax collector to give such notice

as he may herein provide shall

not invalidate any tax certificate of

delinquency, nor shall subject the tax

collector to any damages which may

be sustained by any party injured by

his failure to give such notice.

Section 3. The cost of publishing

such notice shall be added to

become a part of the penalty

charged against the particular tract

of Real Property.

that the following described

on the 1st day of September, 1914,

parcels of Real Property as shown upon

the tax roll, and the amount of
