

WHITE THE COLOR NEW JOB PRINTING

WILL BE THE POPULAR COLOR
ON ACCOUNT OF WAR

**No More Fast Dyes Can be Obtained
From Germany and None Are
Made Here.**

CHICAGO, April 13.—White will be the fashionable color of dress throughout the United States during the coming summer and winter. Chicago drygoods dealers explain that this prospect arises out of necessity created by Europe's war.

The supply of red cloth is practically exhausted and the amount of blue cloth, both in worsted and cotton fabrics, is becoming so small that unless England's blockade is lifted within three or four weeks it will be unsustainable. The United States has less than a two months' supply of dyeing materials.

Inability to obtain German "fast dyes" which are used almost exclusively in the manufacture of American cloth, promises to close the doors of the textile industry of the United States and within 60 days put 400,000 people out of work.

The department of commerce is being appealed to by manufacturers and wholesalers in Chicago, St. Louis and eastern states to use its efforts toward obtaining a supply of "fast dyes."

No blue dyes have come into the country in two months. Importation of black dyes ceased in November. The price of "fast dyes" has increased 700 per cent in 60 days.

A 10 per cent increase in printed and dyed goods has been announced this week to the Chicago wholesalers by the manufacturers. The Chicago representative of an English firm received this cablegram today:

"Make no prices for fall delivery. Advance all prices 10 per cent. Impossible to tell whether we can get our goods."

CAR LOAD OF PAPER

RUSHING BEER PLANT

TO SAN FRANCISCO

SAN FRANCISCO, April 13.—Three shifts of men, working day and night, will begin within a few days the construction of the new brewery for the Banner Brewing Company, which is to move from Seattle to San Francisco as a result of the prohibitory law.

A contract was signed today by the brewing company with the Bond Contracting Company for \$125,000, including the moving and remodeling of the brewery from the Seattle plant to San Francisco, Calif., April 1, 1916. The magnitude of the work will accommodate the movement of about 400 men to complete the work within the given time, a penalty of \$100 per day, or a sum of the same amount, is provided in the contract.
