REPORT ELK KILLED

WARRANT ISSUED FOR HAVING HORNS IN POSSESSION.

Alfred Baines Claims to be Homes Stealer—Game Warden Says Horns for Elk Carnival

Charged with having elk horns in his possession and offering them for sale, a warrant has been issued for the arrest of Alfred Baines, who claims he has a homestead above Allegany. Game Warden Thomas alleges the story is false, that several are implicated and the horns were for transportation to the elk carnival in California.

The offense is a serious one. Very few elk are left. In a recent case in Eastern Oregon the maximum penalty was given for such an offense. Mr. Thomas has the 11 pairs of elk horns in his possession.

CANNERY IS CLOSED KILLED THREE DEER

ARREST T. H. BARRY FOR OPERATING OUT OF SEASON GEORGE MOORE, OF COOSTON, PAYS \$25 FINE

Game Warden Thomas Says Season Closed Until May 22—At Work For Three Weeks

DROWNED IN ROGUE

TWO FISHERMEN FROM GRANTS PASS MEET SUDDEN DEATH

Attempted Perilous Trip to Curry County and Both Lost When Boat Overturned Regarding a recent tragedy on Rogue River, the Port Orford Tribune says:

Two fishermen in attempting to come from Grants Pass to the mouth of Rogue River in a small boat, were upset in the swift waters near Mile creek and drowned. Until the last few years it was considered a very hazardous undertaking to attempt to run the river, and but very few boats had ever successfully made the trip. However, several parties have made the perilous trip this spring to engage in fishing on the lower river, and all ran the gauntlet of swirling rapids and jagged rocks without accident, until the drowning mentioned above, but meager details of which have been learned.
