In referring to the fact that a ROSEHURG, Or., May 7.—Sev- North Bend boy picked up a live and well developed oyster at South Slough esting facts regarding the early ovater growing in this locality,

This paper says:

"In the '80's, the late John Nasburg and J. T. Davis planted a lot of small eastern oysters on the shell and sand bottom at Glasgow, close to where the wreck of the old brig Devens was then lying. Two or three years afterwards some of these oysters were gathered by the aid of tongs fastened to long handles and brought to Marshfield. They had grown to an immense size, far larger than any eastern oyster shipped in here.
