lapse under strain after years in a bridge, house, or barn. It is 'sick' and gives out. "Many lumber yards are full of

timber diseise. "The United States Forest Products Laboratory is engaged in the study of this subject with the end in view of showing lumbermen how to keep their timber free from di-
