**BOTH ASK DAMAGES WIFE TO RECOVER**

**EIGHTH STREET IMPROVEMENT CASE IN CIRCUIT COURT**  
**MRS. GILBERT NOT SERIOUSLY INJURED IN SHOOTING**

Contractors Moon and Barclay seek \$367 and T. H. Barry claims \$400 damages.

Claims and counter claims have arisen out of the injunction brought last year by Mr. and Mrs. T. H. Barry to restrain the improvements in the front of his Eighth street property and today the case is in the Circuit Court, both the plaintiff and the defendant alleging damages.

Contractors N. Moon and James Barclay, having the contract for the improvement of Eighth street north, were enjoined from working in front of the Barry property, the claim being that the original plat showed the ground to be on Seventh street.

The equipment of the contractors was moved. They now claim \$367 damages in their suit, bringing this after the injunction was declared illegal by Judge Coke.

On the other hand, Mr. and Mrs. Barry allege that a garden with its vegetables was destroyed, the damage amounting to \$300 and also that they furnished water for the engines of the contractors to the amount of \$100 for which they ask judgment.

**A. MELTON LOSES SUIT FOR \$4,200 IN CIRCUIT COURT**  
**Broken Leg and Crushed Foot Received in Yard of Coos Bay Manufacturing Company**

 COQUILLE, May 28.—A judgment in favor of the defendant was the jury decision yesterday afternoon in the case of A. Melton versus the Coos Bay Manufacturing Company in which he sued for \$4,200 damages. In December last Melton claims that a load of lumber, improperly loaded onto a truck, fell onto him breaking his leg and crushing the foot. It was shown that the company was not to blame for the accident and nothing will be recovered by Melton.

**MAY DIVIDE STEAM INSPECTION DISTRICT**

Plan to Unite Oregon, Washington and Alaska in One With California Separate

Plans are on foot for the division of the steamboat inspection district of the coast into two districts with a supervising inspector over each one. This will be brought up in a bill to be introduced at the next session of Congress. The plea is that the work in the district is too much for one supervisor.

Captain J. K. Bulger, of San Francisco, now has charge of the coast including Coos Bay. He is in authority over Captains Edwards and Fuller and at the present time is investigating the appeals of the Coquille river boatmen.

Should the new plan carry California would become a separate district with Oregon, Washington and Alaska in a second.
