CLAIMS HE WILL STILL RUN PLANT

B. A. Seaborg Says His Building Affected by Injunction is Only a Warehouse

A telegram was published in The Times several days ago stating that County Judge Wood of Curry County had granted an injunction against B. A. Seaborg and others, on petition of the Wedderburn Trading Company restraining the former from using a building because it was partly on the land of the Wedderburn Company. Seaborg has been building a cannery at Rogue River to run in opposition to the Wedderburn Company plant. In connection with the case the Portland Journal says:

"B. A. Seaborg, manager of the Seaborg Cannery Company, today received a telegram from Fred Caughall, superintendent of the company's cannery on Rogue River, state that County Judge Wood's injunction against the company would not result in a cessation of operations.

"Judge Wood had granted an injunction on the petition of the Wedderburn Trading Company of Gold Beach, which charged that the Seaborg cannery was occupying land belonging to it. Caughall wired that the portion of the cannery property which was said to encroach was only a warehouse and not the cannery building itself."

BANDON MAY GET NEW HARBOR SURVEY

Government Engineer There and Gathers Data on Which to Make a Recommendation

(Special to The Times.)

BANDON, Ore., June 7.—It is quite likely that there will be a new survey of the Coquille River at Bandon with a view of bettering the harbor. J. L. Brownlee, an engineer from the government office of Major Morrow at Portland, has been at Bandon gathering data for recommendation. His recommendations will be based upon the following facts: The amount of shipping or tonnage, the sizes of ships calling at this port, the feasibility and cost of improving, the desire of the citizens and the amount of money they are willing to spend for every dollar contributed by the government.

At a meeting of the people of Bandon recently a resolution was passed recommending that the port commission ask the government to make a complete new survey of the entire harbor.

Details of what could be done to make the harbor better were set forth in the resolutions. One of the chief features is that the north jetty at the mouth of the river be extended from 1000 to 1500 feet beyond the south jetty in order to prevent shoaling on the bar.
